What is Baptism?

Who, What, When, Where, and Why of Baptism:

Baptism is an outward, physical symbol of the inward, spiritual conversion of Christians. It is a picture of what happens in salvation. Baptism is a way for believers to show that they identify with Jesus in His death, burial, and resurrection. The believer obeys God to show their faith publicly through baptism. The believer is showing others that their life is new in Jesus.

1. Entering the water represents dying to sin and being crucified with Jesus, leaving behind the old way of life.
2. Going under the water represents the burial in a grave, showing that sin is washed away and put behind.
3. Coming up out of the water represents rising with Jesus to let the Holy Spirit's power change the way you live to please God.

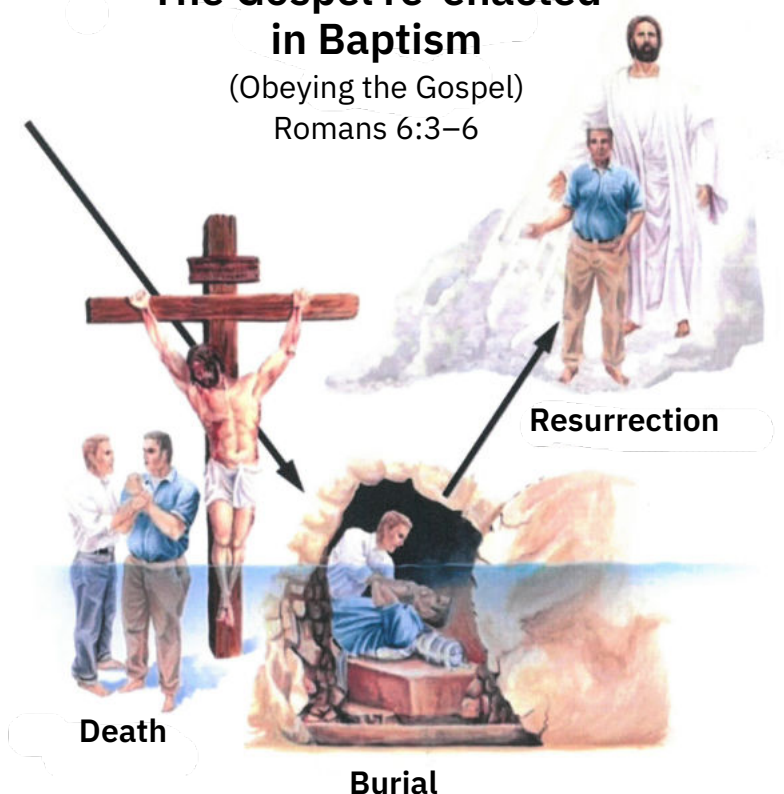

The Gospel re-enacted in Baptism

(Obeying the Gospel)
Romans 6:3-6





I am Titus Addington. Today I publicly testify to God's work in my life. I choose to be a disciple of Jesus.

I know that my decision to follow Jesus is a response because he loved me and chose me first. Galatians 1:15 says, "But even before I was born, God chose me and called me by his marvelous grace." And Jesus said in John 15:16, "You didn't choose me. I chose you. I appointed you to go and produce lasting fruit." The Holy Spirit pursued me a long time before I was born. I look to my grandparents, Waigong Waipo, who are Christians and raised my mom to know God. I look to my grandparents, Yeye Nainai, who are Christians and raised my dad to know God. Before I was born, my parents both chose to follow Jesus. They shared the gospel with me and encouraged me to form my own relationship with God. I remember a specific conversation I had with my mom when she said, "Someday, when you decide to follow Jesus..."

My parents were missionaries in China for 12 years. They brought me to China when I was four months old, and I grew up there until I was 12, so I'm a missionary kid and third culture kid. We moved back to the US in 2020 during the pandemic and I transitioned into 6th grade at Yinghua Academy. However, it wasn't until I joined T4C's Youth Group in eighth grade that I found a community with which I strongly relate.

High school brought many experiences for me to move toward Jesus. The first two years, freshman and sophomore year, I was relatively passive with my faith and consequently my life. But things started to change in my sophomore year. I joined the youth group service trip and Teen Camp, where I experienced what it meant to be part of the body of Christ and to follow Christ. The next year I joined a Christian philosophy camp, where I started to interrogate my view of reality and my values. My understanding of truth started to become oriented around God's truth in the Bible. God started to break down some of the idols in my heart. God made me want to get free from sinful habits and follow his Way. He gave me the grace, forgiveness, power, and supportive community to come alive. I know that Jesus's death and resurrection atones for my sin and gives me new life united with His life. My high school helped me to know Jesus, too. I go to DeLaSalle, a Catholic school. Some of the teachers have been inspiring mentors. Moreover, courses in Bible, theology and ethics required me to ask questions about what I believe and stimulated the development of my Christ-centered worldview.

At the end of junior year, I faced an extremely difficult decision that tested who or what would be the ruler of my life. In this situation, the Holy Spirit helped me to choose: I will follow Christ. This is what I view as my turning point, when I made a commitment to be a disciple of Jesus. I believe that Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life (John 14:6). God is my truth. Jesus is the Lord of my life. I choose the One who first chose me.



Hello everyone, my name is Michael Addington. This is my testimony of how God has worked in my life.

I was born to a missionary family living in China, so God has been with my parents. That shaped how they raised me, showing me Jesus and how to live as his disciple. I didn't realize it when I was younger, but now I see what a sacrifice it is to leave everything to follow Jesus. I am thankful that my parents are such good role models for being a follower of Jesus. From the time I was a little kid, the gospel message was told to me: Jesus is making all things new. He is the king of the world. Jesus died on the cross and rose from the dead so we can receive forgiveness and new life, filled with the Holy Spirit. Now that I am older, I choose for myself to receive Christ.

When our family repatriated to the US from China, I was ten years old. I am a third-culture kid / missionary kid. I was not confident at making friends in the US because I came from such a different background, growing up in China. Thankfully, God provided a great friend group that invited me in. During middle school I wasn't especially concerned with pursuing God as I hadn't yet made Jesus the center of my life. I instead cared about normal things like soccer and academics. Then high school came, and I was really unhappy because I chose to attend a high school where none of my close friends were going. I felt like I had lost so much of my world. Maybe that was especially painful because I had already lost my home in China, too. This hard experience caused me to contemplate my identity, belonging, purpose, and values. Because of these questions, two years ago at Teen Camp, I became more curious about God and wanted to know him more. Since then, I am clear that my identity is in God. I belong to him and with his people. My purpose is to enjoy communion with God and join with what he is doing in the world. My values are shaped by Jesus and his Ways.

Over the past month, I have been reading the Bible and wrote down two verses from Joel that caught my attention. These promises foresee what Jesus would do: give us the Holy Spirit, forgive sin, restore his people, and dwell with them.

After this I will pour out my Spirit

At Senior High camp this past winter, I thought, "I have already chosen to follow Jesus, so why not get baptized?" That is why I am being baptized today. I am making a public confession: I belong to Jesus.



My name is Khoa Nguyen, and I grew up in a Christian family. Ever since I was a baby, my family has been switching through multiple different churches. In 2017, I started going to a church in Minneapolis. Whenever my parents made me come to church, I didn't mind it, but it also didn't feel like a decision I would make on my own. My friends at church were the people that kept bringing me back. Instead of going to church to worship and learn about God, I was going to see my friends. As I kept going to this church many of those friends stopped coming to church, which made going to church start to feel like a task. Church didn't feel like a place for me, but rather a place for my family. I wasn't able to develop the heart to strive for a deep relationship with God. Around sometime in middle school, my sin started to take a different direction. I started to struggle with sin in a deeper way. I knew that it was bad, but I felt no pressure to make a change. It started to become a habit, and my relationship with God became more and more distant.

Around 2 years ago, I was invited to a hotpot night at T4C. Everyone was so welcoming to me, and I felt a sense of community and hospitality that I never felt at any other church I've gone to. I started to come to youth group nights weekly, and my faith in God started to grow exponentially. I was also able to make some of my closest friends. While my relationship with God started growing, so did the desire to defeat my sinful habits. I thought that the only way to defeat it was to rely on my own strength, and to never tell anybody about what I had been going through. There was one night at youth group that was a prayer night. I wasn't expecting much to happen, but one of the prompts was about confessing a sin. I had been keeping my struggles to myself for so long, and God strengthened me with the courage to confess it. After I confessed my sin to the group, I immediately broke down in tears. I felt an immense feeling of safety and comfort from God. I didn't realize until then that being vulnerable and telling people about my struggles would be the biggest step towards defeating sin. The group all laid their hands on me and prayed for me. The weight of keeping to myself was finally lifted, and I knew that bringing my sin to the light would be the only way to truly defeat it. This was the moment that I realized I found the community that I had been longing for ever since I was little.

During the summer of 2025, I was blessed with the opportunity to go to Teen Camp. Being able to meet new people who have the same beliefs as me and that care for me was truly a gift from God. One thing we get to do at Teen Camp is have a one-on-one meeting with a counselor, and a topic I wanted to talk about was baptism. I told my counselor that I've been wanting to get baptized for a while, but I felt like my sin had been holding me back. He reminded me that baptism isn't something you do when you complete the impossible task of becoming a perfect Christian, but rather a public proclamation of your faith in God. This was the final push that I needed which helped me make the decision to get baptized. Ever since confessing my sin at that one prayer night, I've been able to make better habits, and stay accountable with a close group at church. A fire in my heart to want a strong relationship with God was lit.

John 3:20-21 says "Everyone who does evil hates the light and will not come into the light for fear that their deeds will be exposed. But whoever lives by the truth comes into the light, so that it may be seen plainly that what they have done has been done in the sight of God." Keeping your sin to yourself may seem like the best thing to do, but God sees it. In order to live in the truth, you must be honest to God and bring it to the light. I was so scared of what people would think of me if I told them what I had been going through. Little did I know, everyone would be very understanding and compassionate. It wasn't easy telling my friends and my parents about my struggles, but having people by your side to guide you in your journey is a blessing from God. In the midst of sin, I felt so defined by it, but now I know that we are all made in the image of God. We are not defined by our sin. We are defined by our identity in Christ. Jesus means a second chance, a new beginning, and we are purified by his blood. I am so excited to proclaim my faith and new life in Jesus Christ.



As a kid, I always thought of God as more of a historical figure. I knew he existed, and I learned facts about the things he did a long time ago, but that was it. I had no personal relationship with him and didn't even understand the concept of having one. This was really shown when covid hit. My family stopped going to church for a few years, and though my parents still attended online bible studies, I didn't do anything church related. When I finally went back to church for the first time, I realized I didn't think about God once, not a single thought. Even though I recognized how empty my life felt those past few years, I didn't do anything to change that.

The first time I felt God's presence was during JHR while singing praise, and at that moment, I decided to follow Christ. I had always known that God existed but, until now, I had never felt his realness. From then on, I understood what it meant to have God in your life. He wasn't a distant figure, rather someone who always stayed near you and that you could talk to about anything at any time.

As I went through middle school, I started gaining more and more stress, and though I constantly tried to turn to God, I was not able to do so well. I was stuck in a constant cycle of turning to God, then instantly away from him. It was around this time that I found a verse that I would remember to this day. The verse was Matthew 11:28-30. "Come to me all who are weary and burdened and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your soul. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light". Though I wouldn't fully understand this verse for a few years to come, it still gave me hope every time I thought about it.

Going into high school I was able to grow a ton in my faith through a consistent relationship with God. I started praying, reading my bible, and paying attention in sermons. However, up to this day I have still not come close to surrendering. Even with consistent prayer and bible reading, I always struggle to follow God's plans throughout the day. Despite this, I thank God that he has been so merciful and patient with me and continued to be by my side.



Hi, my name is Carsten and this is my testimony

The beginning of my journey with Christ may sound really familiar, my parents were Christian, and brought me to church and taught me to pray and everything. Church wasn't something I really discovered, it was something I inherited. For a long time, following God felt as natural as breathing. I thought I understood who he was.

Then my life fell apart around 7th grade, and what started as daily school stress turned into heavy social anxiety. I'd replay old conversations, and felt mentally exhausted, keeping up my grades, and talking down on myself. Everyday after school I'd head to bed to escape reality, staring up at the ceiling wondering what the point of life was. Anger started spilling out onto the people closest to me, and I believed I had no self worth. The God I grew up with felt distant, then absent. He became someone I hated. I never really opened up to anyone, I just carried it for a couple of years.

One night, I sat down and told God, he could have my life, I mean I had nothing left to lose anyway right? Nothing miraculous happened, no lightning strike or anything. But I had made the decision to keep showing up, keep opening my bible, praying. Over the next few weeks, something actually shifted in my life. I started outgrowing my social anxiety. The joy of being around people came back. I went to a Bible camp still skeptical. I prayed only one thing: that I would feel real love, love I hadn't felt in years. That week I won't ever forget. For the first time in a long time I felt included, my worries gone, and a deep hole in my heart finally filled. I knew then: God had never left me, and after how much I ran away, he didn't meet me with anger, but with mercy, not with shame, but with grace. He was with me the whole time.

I'm still figuring this out. Faith doesn't end in one big story, it's something I keep choosing, one prayer at a time. But I know this, I came to God with nothing but an empty life, and He didn't turn away. He met me where I was. One of my counselors at the bible camp told me about a man named Job in the bible. A righteous man stripped of everything, and still refused to curse God, even in the silence. God eventually restored double what was lost. Many of us (including me) walk away when things get hard, or when God feels silent. Job didn't worship God for what He gave, but worshipped God for who he is.

So if you're in a season of pain, or unanswered prayers, don't give up. Sometimes what feels like silence isn't God's absence, but it's where your faith is proven real. The same God who was silent in Job's suffering, was preparing him for restoration, and He's doing the same for you.

Growing up, my family was non-religious, and we weren't always financially secure. Because of family conflict, we moved around Minnesota constantly, rarely staying in one place for more than two years. I remember my mom telling me that she once sold a family heirloom just so we could put food on the table. Due to my family's situation, I grew up with the mentality of "It is what it is." And while that might sound harmless, it became the way I understood the world. I saw everything in black and white. I focused on everything that was wrong with life, and over time, I began to resent the world and everyone in it. As a teenager and into college, that resentment turned into emptiness. I disobeyed my parents, partied, drank, used substances, and entered relationships that weren't always healthy. I thought freedom would make me happy, but no matter how much I did, I still felt empty. I would come home from night outs and cry myself to sleep, wishing the pain would go away. Even though I hated the world, something inside me had always believed in a higher power.

So, in 2025, I decided to explore the world's major religions. I read different scriptures and talked with friends from different faiths. One of my friends was Christian and he let me read his Bible. At first, I was confused. But every time I was with him, I found myself picking up his Bible, reading a verse, and asking him what it meant. Eventually, we were sitting together talking about the Bible for hours. When he went out of state, I downloaded a Bible app and eventually bought my own Bible. The more I read, the more something began to change within me. For the first time in my life, I felt as though I was seeing the world in color. God's Word challenged the way I had understood life and opened my eyes to a new perspective. I began to understand who God was, who Jesus was, and what it meant to live as a Christian. Through this growing understanding, I came to know God in a way I never had before. One night, after getting off a three-hour phone call with my cousin, during which we spent hours discussing Jesus and the Bible, I finally realized that I wanted to live for Christ.

After studying the bible on my own, I started looking for a church. I was terrified and didn't really know what I was doing. Like everyone, I searched online and came across T4C, where I saw many people in the comments describing how welcoming and friendly the church was; and they were right. Being part of a church community that welcomed and encouraged me, especially as someone who was new to the faith, strengthened my desire to follow Christ.

The church inspired me to grow deeper in my faith, and during my final year of college, I prayed that God would surround me with people who were truly centered on Him.

Coming to Christ was not an easy journey. My faith challenged my friendships and relationships, and I experienced a lot of loss. For the first time, I found myself questioning God, and my trust in Him was tested. I felt frustrated and grieved the loss of relationships that I had held so deeply. Yet, as I continued to trust in the Lord, He answered my prayers in ways I did not expect. He led me to people who were Christ-centered and encouraged me in my faith. Through Epic, a college ministry at the University of Minnesota, I found a community where I could grow in my relationship with God while forming new friendships and strengthening existing ones.

For myself, I struggled a lot with forgiveness within me. I walked around with shame and guilt about my past mistakes before coming to Christ. It was hard this year for me to find the love to forgive myself, and I wondered, how could God ever be so kind as to forgive me when I haven't yet? But throughout this journey, I've come to understand that God's grace isn't something I have to earn. His mercy isn't dependent on whether I think I'm worthy of it. He was there even when I didn't know Him, and He continued to lead me toward Him even when I was running in the opposite direction. So, this baptism is not only my declaration of devotion to God, it is also my declaration that I am choosing to let go of the shame and guilt I've carried, to repent for my past mistakes, and to trust in the grace and mercy that God has already shown me. I spent so much of my life believing that the world was simply, "it is what it is." But now I know that it doesn't end there. God has shown me that there is grace, there is mercy, and there is hope. And Isaiah 30:18 captures what I've come to understand about God and my relationship with Him: "Therefore the Lord waits to be gracious to you, and therefore he exalts himself to show mercy to you. For the Lord is a God of justice; blessed are all those who wait for him."



Hey everyone, I'm Kevin. I'm grateful to be here today. It means a lot to be here telling y'all how I've chosen to trust in Jesus and follow him. Most of my childhood I was part of a Catholic community. In Sioux Falls, there was the church we would attend. I was a part of a youth group for a short while, then we moved to a small town called Ethan when I was 8. With no hispanic community for church we stopped going and I had no real motivation in following Christ. I would say I believe in God but pick and choose what parts I follow. It felt as though the community around me was doing the same thing too. That mindset growing up made me think it was okay to be hateful and do whatever I want even if it was wrong.

What turned me away from this was the first time I left home for basic training in 2022. I was on my own, around a hundred or so other men and women from everywhere in the country. From Hawaii, to Florida, even Puerto Rico. It's all of us, just trying to make it through those grueling ten weeks of constant shouting, punishment, and learning to work together. This creates an immediate clash. Guys were trying to fight every night the first couple weeks, over the littlest differences too. All I can say is that those first weeks were absolute chaos. But it was my third Sunday there that sparked change when the drill sergeant told us to stand outside in formation at 1 for anyone who wanted to go to church.

I hadn't been to a church since I was maybe 12, but I went anyways. I thought it would be a small break from the stress but it ended up changing me. The sermon wasn't even that special, but I was holding back tears from hearing it. Maybe it was the feeling of relief and comfort after being on edge and being yelled at for 3 weeks straight, I'm not totally sure. Anyways, the pastor spoke from the book of Matthew that day and how we need to show love for each other the same way God has loved us. And he finished by praying for all of us, that we may persevere through training and that through God, we can accomplish it.

From then on, I felt a need to make a change in myself. I couldn't just have a relationship with God and ignore his teachings. This was especially important in making it through training. A platoon could never succeed if its members cannot work together. First Corinthians 12 talks of us all being like the different parts of the body, coming together equally. So, I learned to put aside differences. While at Ft. Leonard Wood, I went to every church service after, got myself a Bible, and I began to pray for forgiveness in my previous ways of thinking, a mindset of bias and hate. And it was that last church service before I left; all of us basic training graduates were lined up and they cheered and prayed for our careers; I knew I had heard enough and wanted to truly follow Jesus, to trust in his ways and wholeheartedly believe he was the only way.

And so, I thank God for turning my life around. I made a promise to myself to stop judging others negatively and to put effort into knowing people first. I made friends and became more compassionate, which continues. The world has just felt brighter to me since then. I'm not perfect, but I know God is changing me, and being baptized today is my way of saying yes to the life He's calling me into. Thanks for listening.

何謂洗禮？

洗禮的「誰，什麼，何時，何地，為何」

洗禮是基督徒內在屬靈重生的外在且具體的象徵。它描繪了救恩所帶來的改變。洗禮是信徒表明自己與耶穌的死，埋葬和復活深刻認同的一種方式。信徒藉著洗禮公開表明自己的信心，並以此順服神。信徒向人宣告：自己在耶穌基督裡已經有了新的生命。

1. 進入水中代表向罪死，與耶穌一同被釘在十字架上，離開過去舊的生活方式。
2. 浸入水中代表埋葬在墳墓裡，表明罪已被洗淨，並被除去。
3. 從水中出來代表與耶穌一同復活，讓聖靈的能力改變你的生命，使你能夠活出討神喜悅的生命。

羅馬書 6:3-6

3 豈不知我們這受洗歸入基督耶穌的人是受洗歸入他的死麼？4 所以，我們藉著洗禮歸入死，和他一同埋葬，原是叫我們一舉一動有新生的樣式，像基督藉著父的榮耀從死裡復活一樣。

福音在洗禮中重新演繹

(遵行福音)
羅馬書 6:3 - 6



我是 Titus Addington。今天，我要公開見證上帝在我生命中的作為。我選擇成為耶穌的門徒。

我知道我決定跟隨耶穌是對祂的愛的回應，因為祂先愛我，也先揀選了我。加拉太書 1:15 說：「然而，那把我從母腹裡分別出來，又施恩召我的上帝……」耶穌也在約翰福音 15:16 說：「不是你們揀選了我，是我揀選了你們，並且分派你們去結果子，叫你們的果子常存。」

早在我出生以前，聖靈就已經在尋找我。我想到我的外公外婆，他們都是基督徒，也養育我的媽媽從小認識上帝。我也想到我的爺爺奶奶，他們同樣都是基督徒，並且養育我的爸爸認識上帝。在我出生以前，我的父母都已經選擇跟隨耶穌。他們向我分享福音，也鼓勵我自己與上帝建立關係。我記得有一次和媽媽談話時，她對我說：「有一天，當你決定跟隨耶穌的時候……」

我的父母在中國作了 12 年的宣教士。他們在我四個月大的時候帶我到中國，我一直在那裡長大，直到 12 歲。因此，我是一名宣教士子女，也是一名第三文化孩子。2020 年疫情期間，我們搬回美國，我也在英華學院 (Yinghua Academy) 轉入六年級。然而，直到我八年級加入 T4C 青少年團契，我才找到一個讓我深深感到自己屬於其中的群體。

高中時期，我經歷了許多事情，使我一步步走向耶穌。九年級和十年級的前兩年，我對自己的信仰以及生活都比較被動。但到了十年級，事情開始改變。我參加了青少年團契的服事之旅和 Teen Camp，在那裡我體會到成為基督身體的一部分，以及跟隨基督究竟是什麼意思。

第二年，我參加了一個基督教哲學營，開始重新檢視自己對現實的看法以及自己的價值觀。我對真理的理解開始以上帝在聖經中的真理為中心。上帝開始拆毀我心中的一些偶像。上帝使我渴望從罪的習慣中得著自由，並跟隨祂的道路。祂賜給我恩典，赦免，能力，以及一個支持我的群體，使我重新得著生命。

我了解到耶穌的死與復活為我的罪帶來贖罪，使我得著新生命，並與祂的生命聯合。我的高中生活也幫助我更加認識耶穌。我就讀於 DeLaSalle，一所天主教學校，而其中一些老師成為啟發我的導師。此外，聖經，神學和倫理學等課程要求我思考自己所相信的，也幫助我建立一個以基督為中心的世界觀。

在十一年級結束時，我面對了一個極其艱難的決定，這個決定考驗了究竟誰或什麼才是我生命的主宰。在這個處境中，聖靈幫助我作出選擇：我要跟隨基督。

我把這看作是我的轉捩點——那時，我決心成為耶穌的門徒。我相信耶穌就是道路，真理，生命（約翰福音 14:6）。上帝就是我的真理。耶穌是我生命的主。我選擇那位先揀選我的主。

大家好，我是Michael Addington。這是我的見證，述說上帝如何在我的生命中作工。

我出生在一個住在中國的宣教士家庭，所以從我的父母開始，上帝一直與我們同在。這塑造了他們養育我的方式——他們讓我認識耶穌，也教導我如何活出門徒的生命。我小時候並沒有意識到這一點，但現在我明白，為了跟隨耶穌而離開一切，是多麼大的犧牲。我很感恩，我的父母為我樹立了如此美好的榜樣，讓我看見什麼是跟隨耶穌。

從我很小的時候起，我就聽見福音的信息：耶穌正在使萬物更新。祂是世界的王。耶穌為我們死在十字架上，又從死裡復活，使我們可以得到赦免和新生命，並被聖靈充滿。如今我長大了，我選擇親自接受基督。

當我們一家從中國回到美國時，我十歲。我是一名第三文化孩子，也是一名宣教士子女。因為我在中國長大，背景和美國非常不同，所以剛回到美國時，我對交朋友沒有什麼信心。感謝上帝，祂為我預備了一群很好的朋友，主動接納我，讓我成為他們的一分子。

在國中時，我並沒有特別在意追求上帝，因為那時我還沒有讓耶穌成為我生命的中心。我比較在意的是足球，課業等一般的事情。

後來進入高中，我非常不快樂，因為我選擇了一所我的親近朋友都沒有去的高中。我覺得自己好像失去了原本生活中的許多東西。也許這特別令人痛苦，是因為我早已經失去了在中國的家。

這段艱難的經歷使我開始思考自己的身分，歸屬，人生目的和價值觀。因著這些問題，兩年前在 Teen Camp（青少年營會）時，我開始對上帝更加好奇，也渴望更多認識祂。

從那時起，我很清楚地知道，我的身分是在上帝裡面。我屬於祂，也屬於祂的子民。我的人生目的是享受與上帝的相交，並參與祂在這個世界上所作的工作。我的價值觀則是由耶穌和祂的道路所塑造。

過去一個月，我一直在讀聖經，並寫下了約珥書中的兩段經文，這些經文特別吸引了我的注意。這些應許預先宣告了耶穌將要成就的事：賜下聖靈，赦免罪，復興祂的子民，並與他們同住。

約珥書 2:28

「以後，我要將我的靈澆灌凡
有血氣的。
你們的兒女要說預言；
你們的老年人要做異夢；
你們的少年人要見異象。」

約珥書 3:20 - 21

「惟獨猶大必存到永遠，
耶路撒冷必存到萬代。
我未曾赦免的血債，
現在我要赦免；
因為耶和華住在錫安。」

去年冬天的高中生營會（Senior High Camp）中，我想到：「我已經選擇跟隨耶穌了，那為什麼不接受洗禮呢？」

所以，今天我在這裡接受洗禮。

我正在公開宣告：我屬於耶穌。

我的名字是 Khoa Nguyen，成長於基督教家庭。當我還是嬰兒的時候，我的家人曾經參與多間不同的教會聚會。2017 年，我開始參加一間在明尼亞波利斯的教會。當時是否返教會並不是我能決定，但我並不介意父母要求我去教會，因為教會裡的朋友一直是吸引我回到教會的原因。那時候，我去教會不是為了敬拜上帝，也不是想學習認識祂，而是為了見我的朋友。

後來，我在教會中的朋友逐漸離開了，去教會開始成為我的一項任務；那裡好像是一個只屬於我家人的地方。並不屬於我，也未能幫助我培養出一顆渴望與上帝建立深厚關係的心。

大約在中學時期，我的罪性開始朝著不同的方向發展。我在沈倫中掙扎，雖然明明知道不應該犯罪，但卻沒有感受到非要改變的動力。它逐漸變成一種習慣，而我與上帝的關係也變得越來越疏遠。

大約兩年前，我受邀參加 T4C 的火鍋之夜。每個人都非常熱情地歡迎我，讓我感受到一種歸屬感，是我以前去過的其他教會，從未領受過的熱情款待。從那時起，我開始每週參加青少年團契，我對上帝的信心開始快速成長，也結交了幾位親近的朋友。

當我與上帝的關係逐漸加深時，我越來越渴望能夠勝過自己的罪惡習慣。我原本以為，唯一能勝過罪的方法，就是依靠自己的力量，並且絕對不要告訴任何人我正在經歷的事情。

有一天晚上，青少年團契舉行禱告會。我原本沒有期待會發生什麼特別的事，但其中一個禱告項目是關於承認自己的罪。我一直把自己的掙扎藏在心裡很久，但那天感謝主賜給我勇氣，使我能夠承認自己的罪。

當我向團契的弟兄姊妹承認自己的罪之後，我即時崩潰大哭。我感受到從上帝而來極大的安全感和安慰。直到那時我才明白，敞開自己，把自己的掙扎告訴別人，原來是勝過罪的重要一步。

大家一起按手在我身上，為我禱告。一直獨自承擔的重擔終於卸下了。我知道，只有把我的罪帶到光中，我才能真正勝過它。就在那一刻，我意識到，我找到了自己從小就一直渴望的群體。

2025年夏天，我蒙福有機會參加Teen Camp（青少年營會）。能夠認識許多與我有相同信仰，也真心關心我的新朋友，對我來說這真的是上帝所賜的禮物。在Teen Camp 中，我有機會與輔導員進行一對一的談話，而我很想談的一個主題就是洗禮。我告訴我的輔導員，我想接受洗禮一段時間了，但我覺得自己的罪一直攔阻著我。他提醒我，洗禮不是等到你完成「成為完美基督徒」這個不可能完成的任務之後才做的事，而是公開宣告你對上帝的信心。這就是我所需要的推動力，幫助我作出接受洗禮的決定。自從那次禱告會承認自己的罪之後，我開始建立更好的習慣，學習在教會團契中彼此守望。我內心渴望與上帝建立深厚關係的火焰被點燃了。

約翰福音 3:20 - 21 說：

「凡作惡的便恨光，並不來就光，恐怕他的行為受責備。但行真理的必來就光，要顯明他所行的是靠上帝而行。」把自己的罪藏在心裡，可能看起來是最好的做法，但上帝看見一切。若要活在真理中，我們就必須向上帝誠實，把罪帶到光中。我曾經非常害怕，如果告訴別人我所經歷的事情，他們會怎麼看我。但我萬萬沒有想到，每個人都非常理解我，也充滿憐憫。把自己的掙扎告訴朋友和父母並不容易，但在你的人生旅程中，有人陪伴你，引導你，是上帝所賜的祝福。

在罪的困境中，我曾經覺得自己好像完全被罪所捆綁。但現在我知道，我們都是按照上帝的形像被造的。我們不是由自己的罪來規限，而是由我們在基督裡的身分來定義。耶穌代表著我們擁有第二次機會，新的開始，而我們藉著祂的寶血得潔淨。

我非常興奮，能夠公開宣告我的信仰，以及我在耶穌基督裡的新生命。

小時候，我一直把上帝看作是一位歷史人物。我知道祂存在，也讀過許多關於祂很久以前所做的事，但就只有這些。我與祂沒有個人的關係，甚至不明白與上帝建立個人關係究竟是什麼意思。新冠疫情開始時，這一點表現得尤其明顯。我們家有幾年的時間沒有去教會。雖然我的父母仍然參加線上的查經，但我自己完全沒有參與任何與教會有關的事情。後來，當我終於有機會回到教會時，才意識到，過去那幾年裡，我沒有思想過上帝，連一次都沒有。即使我知道那幾年我的生活感到多麼空虛，我卻沒有做任何事情去改變。

我第一次感受到上帝的同在，是在 JHR（青少年退修會）唱詩讚美上帝的時候。就在那一刻，我決定跟隨基督。我一直都知道上帝存在，但直到那時，我真正感受到祂的真實存在。從此，我開始明白生命中有上帝是什麼意思。祂不是一位遙不可及的人物，而是一位一直在你身邊，你隨時都可以向祂訴說任何事情的上帝。

進入初中後，我開始承受越來越多的壓力。雖然我不斷嘗試轉向上帝，卻沒有辦法很好地做到。我一直陷在一個循環裡：轉向上帝，然後又立刻離開祂。

大約就在那段時間，我找到了一段直到今天我仍然記得的經文。那就是馬太福音 11:28 - 30：「凡勞苦擔重擔的人，可以到我這裡來，我就使你們得安息。我心裡柔和謙卑，你們當負我的軛，學我的樣式；這樣，你們心裡就必得享安息。因為我的軛是容易的，我的擔子是輕省的。」

雖然接下來幾年，我仍然無法完全明白這段經文的意思，但每當我想起它時，它仍然帶給我盼望。進入高中後，我透過與上帝持續而穩定的關係，在信仰上有了很大的成長。我開始禱告，讀聖經，也在講道時專心聆聽。

然而，直到今天，我仍然遠遠沒有做到完全降服。即使持續禱告，讀聖經，我每天仍然總是很難真正按照上帝的計畫生活。即便如此，我仍然感謝上帝，因為祂一直對我充滿憐憫和耐心，也始終陪伴在我的身旁。

你好，我的名字是Carsten，這是我的見證。

我與基督同行的開始，可能聽起來很熟悉。我的父母都是基督徒，他們帶我去教會，也教我禱告等等。教會並不是我自己真正去發現的，而是從父母那裡傳承來的信仰。很長一段時間，跟隨上帝對我來說就像呼吸一樣自然。我以為自己明白祂是誰。

然而，大約在七年級時，我的生活開始崩潰。原本每天的學校壓力，逐漸變成嚴重的社交焦慮。我會反覆回想以前的對話，精神上感到筋疲力竭，一邊努力維持成績，一邊不斷貶低自己。每天放學後，我都會躺到床上，想逃離現實，望著天花板，思考人生到底有什麼意義。我的怒氣開始發洩在最親近的人身上，而我也相信自己毫無價值。我從小認識的那位上帝，感覺越來越遙遠，最後甚至好像完全不在了。祂成了我所憎恨的對象。我從來沒有真正向任何人敞開心扉，只是獨自承受這一切，好幾年都是如此。

有一天晚上，我坐下來對上帝說，祂可以擁有我的生命。反正我已經沒有什麼可以失去的了，對吧？沒有發生任何神蹟，也沒有閃電劈下來之類的事情。但我作了一個決定：我要繼續來到祂面前，繼續打開聖經，繼續禱告。接下來幾個星期，我的生命真的開始發生一些改變。我開始逐漸走出社交焦慮。與人相處的喜樂又回來了。後來，我帶著懷疑參加了一個聖經營會。我只禱告一件事：我想感受到真正的愛——那是我多年來未曾感受過的愛。那一個星期，我永遠不會忘記。在長期以來，第一次感受到自己是被接納的；我的憂慮消失了，心中那個深深的空洞終於被填滿了。那時我知道：上帝從來沒有離開我。在我逃離祂這麼久之後，祂沒有用憤怒來迎接我，而是用憐憫；祂沒有用羞恥來對待我，而是用恩典。祂一直都與我同在。

我現在仍然在學習和探索我的信仰。信仰並非止於一個偉大的故事，而是我繼續作出的選擇，一次一個禱告地走下去。但有一件事我很確定：我一無所有，僅有一個空洞的生命來到上帝面前，而祂沒有轉身離開。祂在我所在的地方遇見了我。在聖經營會中，我的一位輔導員跟我講到聖經裡一個叫約伯的人。一個義人失去了一切，甚至在上帝沉默的時候，他仍然拒絕咒詛上帝。最後，上帝加倍的恢復他失去的一切。

我們當中的許多人，包括我自己，在事情變得艱難時，或當上帝似乎沉默時，就會離開祂。但約伯敬拜上帝，不是因為上帝賜予他什麼，而是因為上帝的本質敬拜祂。

所以，如果你正處在人生痛苦的時期，或正在面對沒有得到答案的禱告，不要放棄。有時，感受到的沉寂，並非上帝缺席；而是你的信心正經歷考驗。那位在約伯受苦時保持沉默的上帝，曾為約伯預備恢復；祂也正在為你做同樣的事。

謝謝大家。

我成長於一個沒有宗教信仰的家庭，家中的經濟狀況也並非一直穩定。因著家庭中的衝突，我們經常在明尼蘇達州各地搬遷，很少在同一個地方居住超過兩年。我記得母親曾告訴我，有一次她甚至賣掉了家中傳承下來的珍品，只為了讓我們一家能夠有飯吃。由於家庭的處境，我從小就抱著「事情就是這樣」的心態。這聽起來或許沒什麼，但它漸漸成為我理解這個世界的方式。我把所有事情看得非黑即白，也常常把注意力放在生命中不如意的事情上。久而久之，我開始對這個世界，以及其中的人，產生怨懟。

到了青少年時期，一直到大學，我心中的怨恨逐漸變成了空虛。我不聽父母的話，參加派對，喝酒，使用毒品，也進入了一些並不健康的感情關係。我以為自由會讓我快樂，但無論我做了多少事情，心裡仍然感到空虛。我常常夜生活結束回到家後，哭著入睡，只希望痛苦能夠消失。雖然我憎恨這個世界，但在我內心深處，一直有某種聲音相信有一位更高的存在。

所以，到了 2025 年，我決定探索世界上的主要宗教。我閱讀不同的經典，也和來自不同信仰背景的朋友交談。其中一位朋友是基督徒，他讓我讀他的聖經。起初，我並不明白其中的內容。但每次和他在一起時，我總會不自覺地拿起他的聖經，讀一段經文，然後問他那是什麼意思。漸漸地，我們會坐在一起，一談聖經就是好幾個小時。當他去了外州時，我下載了一個聖經 App，後來也買了自己的聖經。讀得越多，我自己的內心就開始有一些改變。那是我人生中第一次感覺，原本只有黑白的世界，開始有了色彩。神的話語挑戰了我過去對人生的理解，也開啟了我的眼睛，讓我看見一個全新的角度。我開始明白神是誰，耶穌是誰，以及作為一個基督徒意味著什麼。隨著我越來越明白這些真理，我開始以一種過去從未有過的方式認識神。有一天晚上，我和表親通完三個小時的電話。那幾個小時裡，我們一直在談論耶穌和聖經。掛掉電話之後，我終於清楚地意識到，我想要為基督而活。

在自己開始研讀聖經之後，我便開始尋找教會。當時我非常害怕，也不知道自己究竟該怎麼做。和大家一樣，我上網搜尋，後來找到了 T4C。我看到許多人在留言中提到，這是一間非常友善，樂於接納新朋友的教會，而事實也正是如此。對當時才剛開始認識基督信仰的我而言，能夠進入一個願意接納我，鼓勵我的教會群體，對我有極大的幫助，也更加堅定了我跟隨基督的心志。

教會激勵我在信仰上更深地成長。在大學最後一年，我禱告求神讓我身邊有一些真正以祂為中心的人。

歸向基督並不是一段容易的旅程。我的信仰開始對原本的友誼與人際關係帶來挑戰，也讓我經歷了許多失去。那是我第一次發現自己會質問神我，對祂的信靠也受到考驗。我因失去那些曾經非常珍惜的關係而感到挫折和悲傷。然而，當我繼續信靠主時，祂以我意想不到的方式回應了我的禱告。祂帶領我遇見了一些以基督為中心的人，他們在信仰上鼓勵我。透過明尼蘇達大學的校園事工 Epic，我找到了一個可以在與神的關係上成長的群體，也在其中建立新的友誼，並讓一些原有的友誼更加堅固。

對我而言，另一個長久的掙扎，是學習饒恕自己。在歸向基督以前，我所犯過的錯誤一直讓我帶著羞愧和罪疚生活。今年，我尤其掙扎於如何以愛來看待並饒恕自己。我甚至想：當我都還沒有辦法饒恕自己的時候，神怎麼可能如此慈愛，願意饒恕我呢？但在這段旅程中，我逐漸明白，神的恩典並不是我必須靠自己的努力去賺取的。祂的憐憫也不是取決於我是否認為自己配得。即使在我還不認識祂的時候，祂就已經在那裡；即使我一直朝著與祂相反的方向奔跑，祂仍然持續帶領我歸向祂。因此，這次洗禮不只是我對神表明委身，也是我宣告：我要選擇放下自己一直背負的羞愧和罪疚，為過去所犯的錯誤悔改，並信靠神已經向我顯明的恩典與憐憫。我曾用生命中很長的一段時間相信，一切不過就是「事情就是如此」。但如今，我知道生命並不止於此。神讓我看見，在祂裡面有恩典，有憐憫，也有盼望。以賽亞書 30:18 很貼切地表達了我如今對神以及我與祂關係的理解：「耶和華必等候，要施恩給你們；必然興起，憐憫你們。因為耶和華是公平的神；凡等候祂的，都是有福的。」

大家好，我是Kevin。今天能夠來到這裡，我心裡非常感恩。能在這裡告訴大家，我如何選擇信靠耶穌，跟隨祂，對我來說意義非常重大。我童年的大部分時間都是在天主教的群體中度過的。在 Sioux Falls，我們會去當地的教會，我也曾短暫參加過青少年團契。後來，我八歲時，我們搬到一個叫 Ethan 的小鎮。那裡沒有西班牙裔的教會群體，所以我們就不再去教會了，而我也沒有真正的動力去跟隨基督。我會說自己相信上帝，但卻只挑選自己想遵守的部分。我覺得周圍的人似乎也是抱著同樣的想法。這種從小形成的觀念，讓我以為心懷仇恨是可以的，也讓我覺得即使某件事是錯的，我也可以為所欲為。

真正讓我開始改變的，是2022年我第一次離開家去接受新兵訓練。我獨自一人，和大約一百名來自全國各地的男女一起受訓。我們從夏威夷，佛羅里達，甚至波多黎各而來，大家都只是努力熬過那艱苦的十週——每天不斷被吼叫，接受懲罰，並學習如何彼此合作。這很快就造成了衝突。頭幾個星期，男兵們幾乎每天晚上都有人想打架，而且往往只是因為一些非常微小的差異。我只能說，起初的幾個星期完全是一片混亂。但到了那裡的第三個星期日，一件事開始帶來改變。那天，教官告訴我們，下午一點要在外面整隊，任何想去教會的人都可以參加。

我從大約十二歲以後就沒有再去過教會，但那天我還是去了。我原本以為這只是一個可以暫時離開壓力的短暫休息，沒想到它卻改變了我。那天的講道其實沒有什麼特別，但聽著聽著，我一直忍著眼淚。也許是在連續三個星期都處於緊繃狀態，一直被吼叫之後，那一刻的輕鬆和安慰讓我有這樣的感受，我自己也不完全確定。無論如何，那天牧師從馬太福音分享信息，談到我們需要彼此相愛，就像上帝愛我們一樣。最後，他為我們所有人禱告，求上帝幫助我們堅持完成訓練，也求上帝使我們靠著祂能夠完成這一切。

從那時起，我心裡開始有一個需要改變自己的感動。我不能一方面說自己與上帝有關係，一方面卻忽略祂的教導。這對我能否完成訓練尤其重要。一個排如果成員無法彼此合作，就永遠不可能成功。哥林多前書 12 章講到，我們每一個人就像身體上不同的肢體，雖然各不相同，卻同等重要。因此，我學習放下彼此之間的差異。在 Fort Leonard Wood 受訓期間，我後來每一次教會聚會都參加。我也為自己買了一本聖經，開始為自己過去的思想方式禱告，求上帝赦免我過去帶著偏見和仇恨的心態。在我離開之前的最後一次教會聚會中，我們所有完成新兵訓練的畢業生排成隊伍，大家為我們的未來軍旅生涯歡呼並禱告。就在那時，我知道自己已經聽見了足夠多的信息，我真正想要跟隨耶穌，信靠祂的帶領，全心相信祂是唯一的道路。

所以，我感謝上帝改變了我的生命。我向自己作了一個承諾：不再用負面的眼光論斷別人，而是先努力去認識一個人。我開始交朋友，也變得更能憐憫體諒人，而這個改變直到今天仍在持續。從那時起，世界對我來說變得更加明亮。我並不完美，但我知道上帝正在改變我。今天接受洗禮，就是我對祂呼召我進入的新生命說「是」的一種方式。謝謝大家聆聽我的見證。
