#### **Transportation Committee**

1. Currently, there are about nine brothers to serve the church bus driver role at T4C , but need more people who are willing to serve in driving church bus to ease the burden on existing drivers.
2. Starting in early 2024, pick up a number of English-speaking students from the University of Minnesota to attend T4C Sunday worship services.
3. A new 15-seater van was purchased to replace the old church bus.

### **Building maintenance, repairs.**

## 2023-24 Mission Committee Annual Report

### **Committee Members:**

### **Cross-Cultural Ministers and Organizations**

Our church is currently supporting a total of fourteen families and individuals doing ministry cross-culturally: one family in Europe, six families in the United States, and seven families in Asia. Their ministry roles and connotations are diverse: they are engaged in cross-cultural missionary promotion and training ministries, caring missionary ministries, international churches, university campus ministries, theological education or community ministries, church planting ministries, and bilingual churches. , training church leaders, teaching the Bible and leading Bible studies, mentoring new colleagues, doing discipleship training, art and culture-related ministries, administrative leadership of missionary agencies, producing radio programs and Bible translation, etc. In addition to these fourteen families, we still have close contact with a family that was in Asia in the past and they are currently waiting for God's guidance.

### **Work of the Mission Committee (MC)**

- MC meets regularly monthly online. In addition to discussing Mission Week planning and mission-related matters, it also invites visiting cross-cultural workers to the meeting to share their ministries and current situations. We encourage, provide support, and pray for them.
- Each of our workers is assigned to a MC member who is responsible for the care of the worker by regularly connecting with them and providing appropriate and timely support. The MC will also pass on the prayer needs to the members of the church and together we support them.
- In the past year, several missionaries from Europe, Asia and the United States returned to MN for furlough. The MC communicates their needs in the church to pray and care for them. They also provided practical help: transportation, food, financial support etc. The missionaries also shared their ministries with the MC, church pastors, and church members at dinner gatherings.
- Update the personal needs of the missionaries and their ministry prayer requests weekly, so that members of the church can be more involved in the mission ministries and missionaries.
- The church missions bulletin board regularly updates the current status of each missionary worker.
- Adopt the 2024 mission budget and make appropriate adjustments and support for some missionary organizations based on local needs of mission ministries.

### **Missions Weekend**

- The 2023 Mission Weekend October 6-8. Theme: Bringing hope to the world. On Friday night, Adam Go shared about the gospel ministry on American university campuses. Lizzy and Cheryl Alexandr shared about their ministry in Taiwan and shared some of our missionaries' current situations in a video, including family introductions, ministry, and

prayer requests. Finally, we prayed for them in small groups by using the Missionary Prayer booklets. The evening was well attended. There were three workshops on Saturday, and participants can choose any two topics to participate in. Adam Go shared the messages of Generation Z, their needs and desires for the gospel. Lizzy shared how to 'Learn' about missions and how to 'Welcome' and receive people from different cultures. Cheryl shared the resources and methods of 'Sending' and 'Prayer'. They also shared messages in all three congregations on Sunday. Many brothers and sisters commented that the mission weekend was deeply beneficial and inspiring. We look forward to the next gathering.

- The Mission Prayer Booklets in Chinese and English have been updated and were available at the Mission weekend.
- 2024 Mission Weekend October 25-27 is in planning

### **Short Term Missions (STM)**

### **Missionary Care Program**

The missionary care program started in January 2024. In view of the fact that missionaries face spiritual battles, cultural shock, and many other challenges, they all require long-term care and prayer from the church pastors and members. We have invited seven fellowship groups to participate in this program. A fellowship group cares for a missionary family or individual. The current plan is to contact participating fellowships every six months to listen to feedbacks and suggestions. Thanks to all seven fellowships for their willingness to participate.

### **Mission Plan and Goals for 2024-25**

- Listen and review the 2024 short-term mission reports
- Implement the collected suggestions from PEC and the congregations at the 2023 Mission weekend. We hope the 2024 gathering will be more in line with the church theme and members' understanding and participation in missions.
- Thanks to the church for its emphasis on missions and the brothers and sisters for their weekly prayers for missions. Encourage members to make more use of the Mission Prayer Booklets to remember the missionaries and their ministries.

"Missionary Care", each participating fellowship provides feedbacks and adjustments. Through practical care, communication and intercession, brothers and sisters will establish a close relationship with the missionaries and understand their physical, emotional and spiritual needs. So that both the missionaries and brothers and sisters will be encouraged and will have a mutual deeper understanding of missions. We look forward to increased number of caring fellowship groups and missionary families.

The Trustees and VitalPath negotiated a Lease Amendment that extends VitalPath's lease for 3 additional years (with the potential to extend for 2 additional years); the lease may be terminated by either party with a 1-year notification. The Lease Amendment was executed by VitalPath and the Deacon's Board in the fall of 2023.

VitalPath continues to be an ideal tenant for T4C. VitalPath completed a full HVAC replacement and upgrade for their space in 2023 and they continue to work on internal and external improvements to modernize their space and align the Terrace facility to their other metro locations.

**Summary**

Praise God and thank you everyone for your faithful support to T4C.

As of the 2023 year-end, T4C's Total Regular Income was \$1,113,254 and the Total Regular Expenses were \$876,909, resulting in a Net Regular Income of \$236,345. Income was 105.35% of the budget (\$56,577 more than budget) and Expense was 83% of the budget (\$179,768 lower than budget). 2023 Income increased by \$21,723 and expenses were \$30,046 more than 2022.

2023 Total Regular Income included Regular Offerings of \$1,013,047, Stock Offerings of \$91,710 and Investment interest income of \$8,497. Regular and stock offerings together made up a total offering of \$1,104,757 an increase of \$15,096 from 2022. Investment interest income was \$8,497, an increase of \$6,627 from 2022. Overall, the income increased \$21,724 in 2023 compared to 2022.

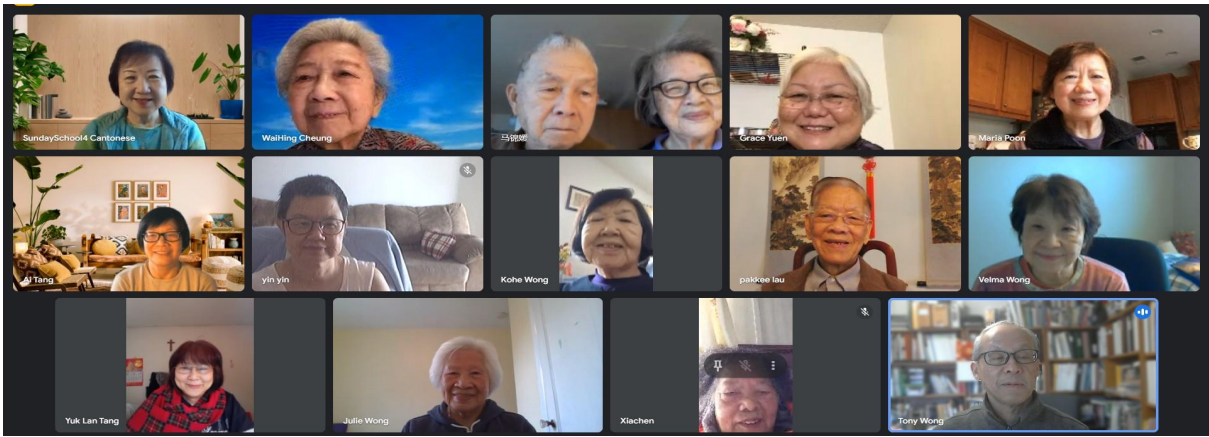

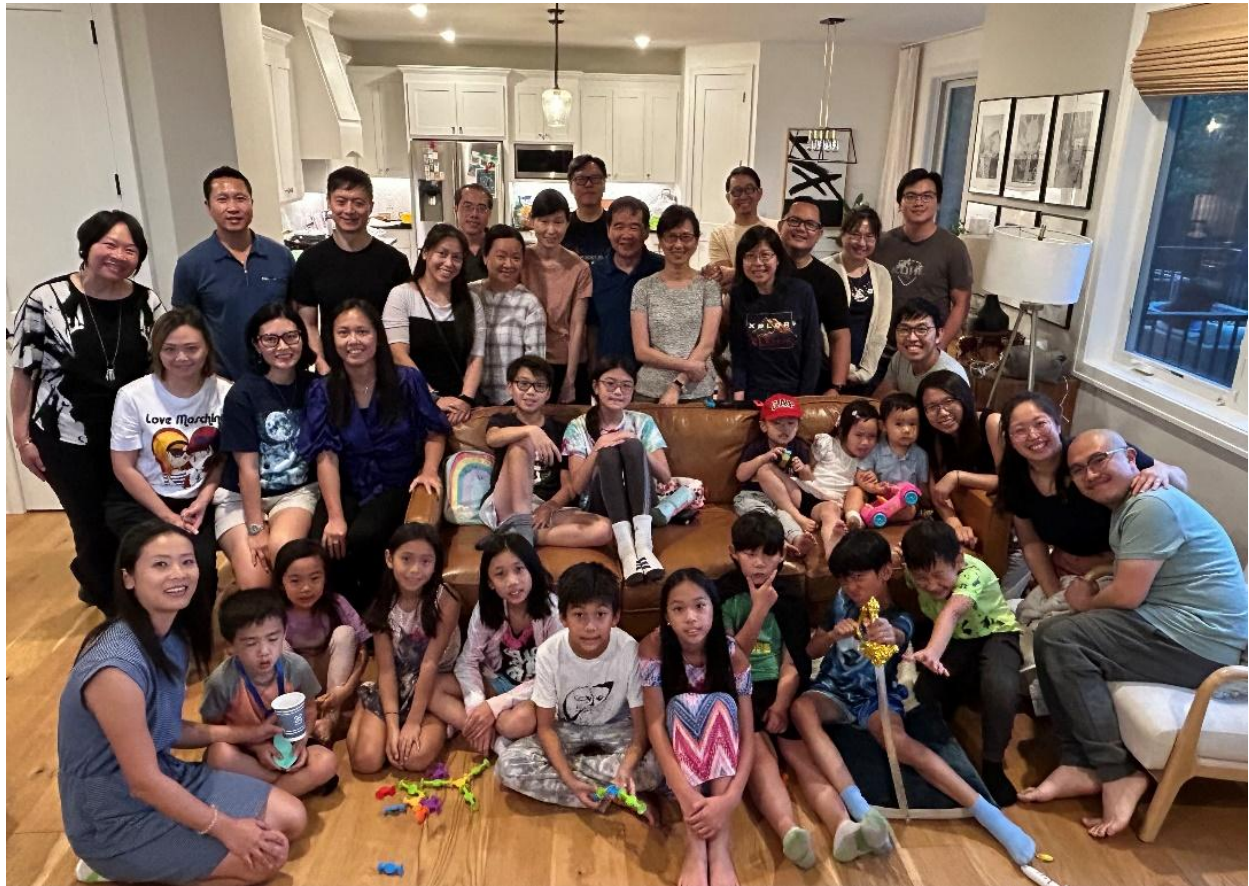
